SCHEDULE and LOCATION

The course is held at the Torino [Anatomy Institute](#), Corso Massimo d'Azeglio 52, Torino. ON february 28, transfer to the Neuroscience Institute Cavalieri Ottolenghi will take place by a coach service.

How to reach Torino

Torino is located in northwest Italy, close to France (about 100 km) and Switzerland (about 140 km) and is easy to reach by car, train or airplane.

By plane

The Torino airport (Caselle International Airport Sandro Pertini [TRN], about 15 km northwest of the city centre) is connected daily to both domestic (Bari, Cagliari, Catania, Lamezia Terme, Roma, Palermo, Trapani) and international destinations (Amsterdam, Barcelona, Brussels Charleroi, Dusseldorf, Frankfurt, Istanbul, London Gatwick, London Stansted, Madrid, Munich, Paris CDG).

From the airport to downtown: please check on the airport website

Please note that the ARRIVA SADEM bus service connects directly the city centre of Turin to Torino Airport and viceversa. The Express bus departs every half hour, at 0' minutes and at 30' minutes, from Monday to Friday. On weekends, the frequency of direct buses will be every hour, starting at 30' minutes. Journey time: about 30 minutes

By train
